Purpose of Report

To consider an application for a Premises Licence Application for Bishton Hall, Bellamour Lane, Wolseley Bridge Stafford, Staffordshire ST17 0XN.

1 Detail

- 1.1 On 8 April 2021 the Council received a premises licence application for Bishton Hall, Bellamour Lane, Wolseley Bridge, Stafford.
- 1.2 The application was made by Mr Charles Hanson the Managing Director of Hansons Auctioneers and Valuers Limited, 18 St Christophers Way, Pride Park, Derby, Derbyshire, DE24 8JY.

 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.





Re: Application for entertainment license at Bishton Hall, Bellamour Lane, Stafford.

It has been brought to my attention that there is an application currently being made for license for various types of public entertainment at Bishton Hall, including the playing of live/recorded music in external areas of the premises until 23.00.

Bishton Hall backs onto my property (Bishton Lodge, Bishton Lane, ST170XW), where I live with my wife and two young children. The two properties are only separated by 200 yards of open field and the potential for noise is extremely worrying. The impact upon our privacy and more importantly the emotional health and well-being of our children is cause for great concern. The children's bedrooms both overlook the hall and evening entertainment in the external areas of the hall would undoubtedly keep them awake at night.

Concerns have been raised about the use of local agricultural and residential roads by visitors to proposed events at Bishton Hall. These roads would likely become quickly congested during the event and may be affected by vehicles left overnight by visitors who have enjoyed a drink during the event.

Another concern is the potential for trespass into local properties and agricultural land by pedestrians/ individuals seeking short cuts. This is particularly worrying given that only an easily accessible field separates our property and Bishton Hall. Our children constantly play in the garden and the potential for trespassers from Bishton Hall does not bare thinking about.

I strongly object to the proposed plans to stage outdoor events of this nature at Bishton Hall.


I have video footage of a private event that took place at the Hall last summer and would be happy to share it with the council. The footage illustrates just how easily the sound travels to our property.

I note that the above application is for various forms of entertainment and the serving of alcohol, both indoors and outdoors at the premises. I wish to formally object to all those elements of the application that would involve outdoor activities, notably cinema, dancing, live music, recorded music and the consumption of alcohol. The reason for my objection is the proximity of the grounds/gardens to my property being only approximately 200 yards across an open field. Outdoor events could involve much larger numbers of visitors than would be the case for indoors. The noise would be considerable in an otherwise peaceful rural hamlet. The late evenings, up to 23.00/23.59, would not be acceptable as this is beyond my bedtime and that of my neighbours some of whom have young children.

Bishton Hall was a private school when I moved to Bishton Lane 15 years ago. Since being sold quite recently an application for change of use was granted for an auction house with subsequent permission for tea rooms, I have absolutely no objection to these uses. 

Our concerns are as forlows:

(1) Traffic. Bellamour Lane is a LANE not a road. It was not designed for heavy traffic.

There are already regular contisions between cars and walls and railings in the lane, most particularly at the exits of Bishlon Hall. The raised volume of traffic caused by events will increase this danger. The main exit from Bishlon Hall is on a blind corner.

D. Noise. Noise created by live and recorded music ontside causes nuisance to the neighbouring householders. in both Bellamour Lane and Bishton Lane. It also causes distress to farm animals and particularly to the ponies in the fields adjacent. Fireworks are a major problem to domestic animals.

(3) Parking. I wish to lodge my objection to Bishton Hall's application for Live Music/Entertainment and Alcohol license. Bishton Hall is located in a very rural location, with adjacent farmland, livestock and stables in close proximity. Music from the proposed application will be intrusive to those in the surrounding area, with the summer events of 2020 proving to be a highly unwelcome noise during the day and late into the evening. To repeat this 7-days a week presents residents with a potential nightmare situation. Live music, dance and disco music often relies on a strong bass beat, creating a booming noise into neighbouring houses. The proposed outside space will generate noise even louder to neighbours than that inside and is therefore likely to cause more of a disturbance and ruin the quiet enjoyment of our gardens and properties.

There will be inevitable additional noise from the car park and traffic as restricted access/exit will see an exodus of vehicles leaving the premises at the same time.

 Bishton Hall is situated on a very narrow, unclassified country road connecting the A51 at Wolseley Bridge with the B5013 near Colton. Not only is it narrow but it is very windy with blind corners and slopes, no pavement and cars have to use passing places in several areas. 	
2. Both the entrance and the exit to the Hall are located on a blind Z bend making entrance and egress potentially dangerous. There is also close by the dangerous crossroads at Bishton Lane.	
3. The road was not built to cope with the volume of traffic the granting of such a licence would generate. It is also closed several times a year because of flooding under the railway bridge.	
4. There is likely to be insufficient parking space within the Hall grounds so "excess" cars will park in the road which will cause problems for ordinary cars to get by, never mind emergency vehicles.	
5. The Hall is in a country area and large tractors with trailers frequently use the road, particularly in the harvest season. They would be unable to pass any parked cars.

We wish to express our objection to the above licence as residents of Bishton Lane and Bishton Hall and Grounds being in very close proximity to quiet residential housing on the following grounds. We like other residents moved to Bishton, a small hamlet, for the tranquillity, seclusion, open countryside and peaceful surroundings and wish this to remain so. We enjoy and spend a lot of time in our garden and feel the potential noise nuisance from live/recorded music, open air films and other planned events will spoil our right to peace and enjoyment of the natural environment particularly in the evenings and weekends. As well as the actual music and voices there will be the constant banging vibration that travels. As there are residential properties and gardens in the immediate vicinity we do not feel that noise up to 11pm late at night and potentially all day from 10am is compatible with this location. There are other sites in Staffordshire that hold similar events and they are remote with no surrounding properties to be affected directly.

We have concerns that where alcohol is involved there is the possibility of criminal and disorderly behaviour becoming a public nuisance.

We have concerns about the safety of residents, children and visitors to the Hall on the narrow country roads to and from Bishton Hall with the increase in traffic these events will generate. We are avid walkers and use Bellamour Lane many times a week for circular walks. It is a dangerous road with very poor access on a corner to Bishton Hall and field opposite, cars and large agricultural vehicles travel fast along the road, more often than not on the other side of the road around this corner not expecting to meet oncoming vehicles or walkers. Many vehicles now obstruct or reverse onto Bellamour Lane at the nearby junction unsure where they are and again this will increase with more vehicles attending events.

We have concerns vehicles attending the hall will be parking in Bishton Lane causing a public nuisance and safety issues, this has happened in the past at an annual event at nearby Wolseley Park and overflow traffic parked in Bishton Lane. The lane is narrow and the verge is for resident's parking that do not have driveways, on these occasion's residents returning to their homes were unable to park. Access is needed by agricultural and railway works large vehicles at all times and there is potential for resident's cars being

damaged due to vehicles trying to pass obstructing vehicles parked in the lane. Noise and disturbance from visitor returning to their cars well after 11pm will have a negative impact on resident's lives.

and have concerns with this request relating to the increase of public nuisance.

Before the Hall was purchased by Hanson Auctioneers it operated as a school for many years, during this time there was the occasional event/wedding at the weekend. These always caused an amount of public nuisance due to the volume of PA/music systems and the late night traffic and noise when people left the event in the early hours, the area around the hall is sparsely populated and normally very quiet so any disturbance is very noticeable.

Also, there was never any suitable parking for coaches and as such they would wait outside my property in the early hours waiting for the last stragglers to appear from the party/wedding /etc, these stragglers would normally be worse for wear and have no consideration for the residents nearby.

The school only held a few events a year so it was a nuisance but something you can live with on the odd occasion especially as it helped the schools very tight funding.

Last year there was a film event held at the Hall, the film itself was quiet as we did not hear much noise later in the evening, but the warm up DJ who was setup in front of the house played very loud music for several hours before the film started, being so close to the Hall this impacted us more than the other local residents.

The proposed application is asking for a license for 7 days a week 9am to midnight, so effectively all day every day. This means that every day they could potentially host an outdoor event during the summer months, causing nuisance when local residents are also likely to be enjoying their gardens and outdoor spaces.

With the hall now being run purely as a business rather than a school you would expect from their perspective that every weekend in the summer months could host an event/wedding/party bringing with it a very much increased level of public nuisance and disturbance to the local area.

I am not totally against the hall hosting events but feel that the proposed unrestricted license will change this rural and very quiet location, normally all we can hear are the birds and the occasional car. If this application is approved and events start to be much more frequent and potentially every weekend I fear that we'll no longer be able to enjoy the surroundings due to the level of noise disturbance based on our experience from previous events held at the Hall.

It is not just the noise nuisance, it is also the concern of the increased volume of traffic on Bellamour Lane, which is not very wide and the 's' bend right by the Hall's main entrance is a hazard at the best of times, increased traffic is going to increase the likelihood of accidents in the lane.



The purpose of this letter is to inform you that we the owners of this property wholly and unreservedly object to all the new owners proposals.

- 9 The Applicant can summarise their case and comment briefly on the any parties replies to his questions, they cannot introduce new issues.
- All parties will then withdraw whilst the Sub Committee considers the case.
- The Sub Committee will deliberate in private only recalling any party to clear points of uncertainty on evidence already given. If recall is necessary all parties will return notwithstanding only one is concerned with the point giving rise to doubt.
- The Chairman will announce the Sub Committee's decision and will give reasons for the decision to the parties at the end of the hearing; the decision being confirmed in writing afterwards.
