Variation of Premises Licence - The Dog House, Stafford

Purpose of Report

To consider a full Variation application for The Dog House, Martin Street, Stafford, ST16 2LB.

1 Detail

- 1.1 On 15 June 2022 the Council received an application for a full variation of the licence for The Dog House, Martin Street, Stafford.
- 1.2 The application was made by Lee Henderson, director of The Dog House Stafford Limited who are the premises licence holders. Mr Henderson is the Designated Premises Supervisor of The Dog House.
- 1.3 The purpose for the variation of the licence at the above premises is to allow for longer opening hours, extension to the current licensable activities and the removal of the requirement to have door staff on Fridays and Saturdays. Additional licensable activities including provision of live and recorded music until 02:30 are included in the variation application.
- 1.4 There has been 1 relevant representation objecting to this variation attached in the **APPENDIX**. This was received by the Council's Environmental Health section.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Removing the need for bouncers every Friday and Saturday would allow the budgeting for an extra bar staff. This would allow for more toilet checks, more time when checking IDs, and better management of customers. Bouncers will be hired for specific events that we know they will be required.

c) Public safety

We will ensure that no customers consume an unsafe quantity of alcohol. Taxis will be available on request. Having an extra bars staff in place of a bouncer would allow spills to be spotted and clean up quicker.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Customers are asked to leave quietly at the end of each night, and there are signs at the door. Problem customers are asked to leave.

e) The protection of children from harm

We stictly enforce challenge 25. Any films not suitable for adults will be upstairs and monitored.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided 0 by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the 0 entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or o on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling 0 circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Having reviewed the application for The Dog House, we have concerns about the extended opening hours for this premises. Therefore, currently Environmental Health, as a responsible authority, object to this application. The summary of it is that there are residential properties adjoining the premises on both sides, on Martin Street and St Martins Place, as well as residential properties 40 meters further down on Martin Street (County Buildings). The application includes live music and recorded music until 02:30.

Given the close proximity of the residential properties, an extension of the hours is likely to give rise to a public nuisance. Therefore, we have asked the applicant to hire a noise consultant to do a noise impact assessment, but do not anticipate that this will be available for some time.

I have had discussions with him and he has suggested that the live music could be until 00:00 but he would still want to be open and have recorded music until 02:30.

As the deadline for comments and objections is today, Environmental Health wish to object on the basis of prevention of public nuisance, pending a noise report being submitted and reviewed!

LICENSING SUB COMMITTEE PROCEDURE

The Chairman will introduce the Members of the Sub-Committee and invite those present at each hearing to introduce themselves.

- 1 The Licensing Officer outlines the details of the application, and relevant representations received, to the Sub Committee.
- 2 Any person who has submitted a relevant representation will be given the opportunity to present details of their representation. The running order for such presentations will be decided by the Chairman prior to the first presentation commencing.
- 3 Following each submission, the Applicant or his representative may question the person concerned.
- 4 Members of the Sub-Committee may then ask questions of the person concerned.
- 5 Once all relevant representations have been heard, the Applicant or his representative presents his application for the licence and calls any witnesses in support.
- 6 Any person who has submitted relevant representations may then question the Applicant (if he has given evidence) and any witnesses.
- 7 Members of the Sub- Committee may then ask questions of the Applicant and any witnesses.
- 8 All parties who have presented relevant representations can summarise their case and comment briefly on the Applicant's replies to questions. They cannot introduce new issues.
- 9 The Applicant can summarise their case and comment briefly on the any parties replies to his questions, they cannot introduce new issues.
- 10 All parties will then withdraw whilst the Sub Committee considers the case.
- 11 The Sub Committee will deliberate in private only recalling any party to clear points of uncertainty on evidence already given. If recall is necessary all parties will return notwithstanding only one is concerned with the point giving rise to doubt.
- 12 The Chairman will announce the Sub Committee's decision and will give reasons for the decision to the parties at the end of the hearing; the decision being confirmed in writing afterwards.
