Economic Growth Development and Regeneration Project Updates

1 Purpose of Report

1.1 To update Committee on progress across a number of key development and regeneration projects within Stafford and Stafford Borough.

2 Recommendation

2.1 That the report is noted.

3 Key Issues and Reasons for Recommendation

3.1 This report sets out the main updates that have occurred since Committee was last updated in July. Work continues across the full programme of projects even where individual projects are not contained within this update.

4 Relationship to Corporate Business Objectives

4.1 The development and regeneration programme currently underway in Stafford Borough supports delivery of all four Business Objectives in the Council's Corporate Business Plan 2021-2024. It also delivers against the five Growth Priorities in the Economic Growth Strategy for Stafford Borough 2020-2025.

5 Report Detail

- 5.1 Following a comprehensive update across all major projects at September 2022 Scrutiny it was agreed that for future Committee meetings there would be a standing item on this matter. The content of the report and updates will vary dependant on progress against individual project milestones.
- 5.2 Projects with significant progress updates within this report are as follows:

Future High Streets Fund

Further progress has been made with the commercial negotiations that support the transformation programme. Once this is concluded Members will receive a detailed update. The first two projects with scheduled on-site works have progressed as follows:

a) Market Square Renovation

Since Members were last updated the paving works have moved into the public highway and the herringbone pattern now being laid shows the realignment of the road around the Square itself.

Works are still on track for an Autumn completion.

b) Station Approach

The closing date for tenders for the on-site contractors for this project was 12 July and the evaluation process concluded in early August. Confirmation of the appointed contractor will be shared shortly.

Meecebrook Garden Community

Members were advised in July of the work underway on the Strategic Outline Business Case for a new railway station at Meecebrook. The draft business case was completed during July and contractors SLC are now reviewing the detail with officers.

Westbridge Park, Stone

Works are progressing on Westbridge Park with the new Woodland Play Trail now open to the public. The sunken garden is nearing completion and the new play area and Multi Use Games Area are underway. The new wheeled sports area work is due to commence shortly and works are on target for November completion.

UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF)

On 5 July the Council received notification on behalf of the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities that, following the assessment of

our end of year report, the Secretary of State has allocated the funding for financial year 2023/2024 in respect of UKSPF. This is split between capital of £625,538 and revenue of £508,757 and enabled the following projects within the approved Investment Plan to get underway:

- Continuation of funding the Crown Wharf Theatre
- Stone Scout Hut building improvements
- Westbridge Park car park works
- Investment into the Staffordshire History Centre project
- Rural business to business grant scheme
- Green Solutions business grant scheme
- Rural Enterprise Feasibility Study
- 5.3 Members were updated in July that an additional funding stream was awaiting Government decision. The current position is as follows:

Rural England Prosperity Fund (REPF)

The Investment Plan addendum submitted in November 2022 was approved and funding totalling £121,984 was received in July for this additional strand of funding within the UKSPF programme. This enabled a call for projects from the community sector with press releases, social media and email marketing raising awareness of the fund.

The call for projects closes on 30 September. As at 15 August 5 key projects that meet the eligibility criteria have been identified and will be now progress to full application stage. Should these projects be approved by the REPF panel then in the region of £100,000 of grants will be issued.
